Introduction: Paul finally comes back to where he began this discussion of eating meat offered to idols. Most of the principles we find in 1 Corinthians 10:23-11:1 have been examined in chapter 8. Except for the example of eating during an actual pagan worship service, believers are at liberty to eat meat offered to idols. Two basic and fundamental principles have emerged from our studies. Christians have freedom in morally neutral matters, but their behavior must be tempered with concern for others - believers and non-believers alike. Does the Bible have guidelines or principles in determining what is right and what is wrong in questionable things? There are three basic and fundamental principles that you need to apply as you determine what is right and what is wrong in questionable or grey areas of daily living. Remember these three words: LAW - LIBERTY - LOVE.
