THE ROAD TO FREEDOM BEGINS WITH GOD

Exodus chapters 6 through 11 - (Continued from March 17, 2019)

INTRODUCTION God made His many promises to Moses and the Children of Israel and stated His purpose for which He made those promises, and, as we have seen, God's purpose will always be opposed in some fashion or other by His enemies. God then assured Moses of His provision that would enable him to fulfill His purpose for him and the Children of Israel. Because the heart of Pharaoh was so resistant to God's will we have been looking at how God would persuade Pharaoh to do the very thing he was refusing to do – give the Children of Israel their freedom. God's means of persuasion was to send ten successive plagues upon Pharaoh and the land of Egypt. In the six plagues we have looked at we have been observing that each of the plagues conveyed a very definite message from God. As we consider the next three plagues, 7 - 8 & 9, we will see by the eighth plague, that all of Pharaoh's officials could readily see God's judgments had practically ruined the land, and expressed such to their king pleading with him to let the Israelites go free. Unfortunately Pharaoh refused to give in thinking he was showing great strength and resilience; actually God was using him to demonstrate His own power and sovereignty (Exodus 9:16; Romans 9:17-18
