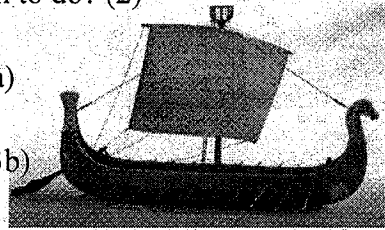

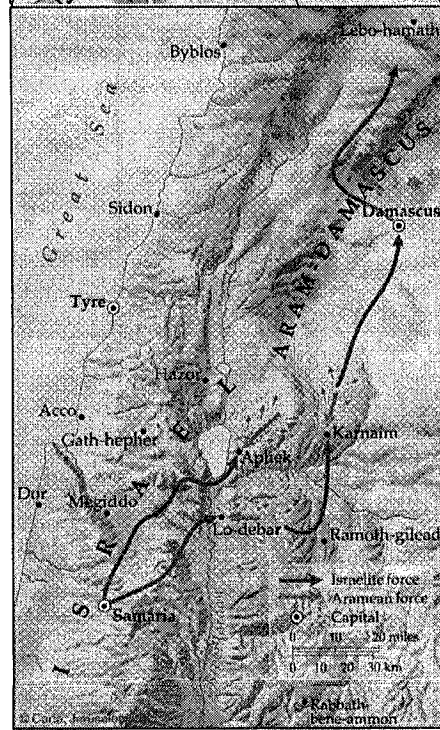
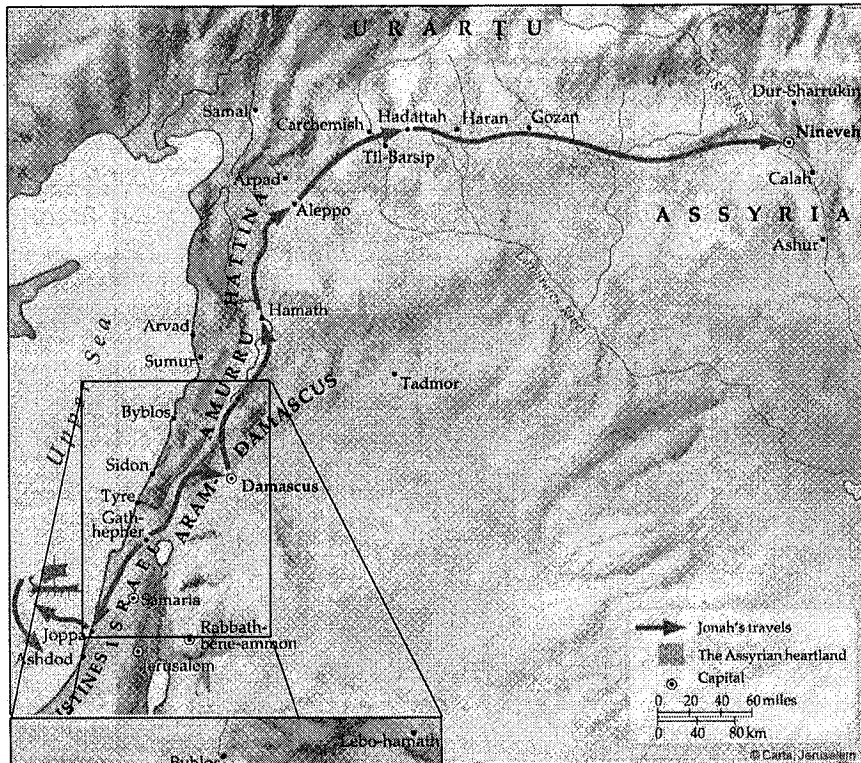
I. Jonah Flees from the Presence of the Lord (1-3)

Above is shown a map of Jonah's travels. Nineveh and Tarshish were about as far apart as two cities could be, especially from Jonah's hometown of Gath-hepher (Jonah 1:1-3)

On the left is shown a map of the battles of Jereboam II where he regained lost territory not seen since the days of Solomon, just as Jonah predicted (2 Kings 14:23-27)
